





Process of

Individualized Prior Learning Assessment (iPLA)



College-level learning gained through work and life experience (iPLA)

- More than 50% of students graduate with PLA credits
- On average students receive approximately 35 iPLA credits.
- The fee for this process is a **one-time flat fee of \$700**, waived for U.S. veterans and active military.
- Pre-evaluated PLA (e.g., professional licenses and trainings, such as: Real Estate, Law Enforcement, EMT Certification, Insurance, CASAC, etc.) are 'transferred' in at no cost



Combined Bachelor's/Master's Degrees

Empire State College students accepted into the combined bachelor's/master's degree program will take specified master's level courses during their bachelor's degree at the undergraduate rate and have them count towards their degree.

Current students should have a minimum of **60 credits completed** (enrolled at least one term at SUNY Empire State College) and a minimum **3.2 GPA** (recalculation of the most recent 60 credits earned).

Non Degree Study Options

You may enroll as a non matriculated student if:

- You are not interested in earning a degree at this time.
- You want to try a study or two before applying.
- You need or want a few specific studies for work or personal interest.
- You need courses to fulfill degree requirements at another institution.

As a nonmatriculated student:


- You are not eligible for federal or NYS financial aid.
- You may be eligible for funding from a third-party sponsor such as your employer or union.

To enroll:

- Fill out an online application at www.esc.edu/nmapply
- Non-matriculated USW members would be eligible for ICD funding (not spouses or retirees).
- As per the partnership, for <u>matriculated</u> studies spouses and retirees are eligible for the scholarship and application fee waiver, but are not eligible for ICD tuition assistance.




Admission Requirements



- Online admissions application, including a 300-word essay. (SUNY or CUNY associate's degree students are exempt from the essay no matter how far back it was earned. However, if a student is pursuing a second bachelor's degree they will need to submit an essay).
- Request official college transcripts be sent to SUNY Empire.
- Submit proof of high school completion (official high school transcript, copy of high school diploma, GED/TASC scores).
 - \$50 orientation fee in lieu of payment use fee waiver code ECPTRICD and receive a one time/first term \$100 Better Together Scholarship

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LABOR STUDIES & LEARNING OUTSIDE OF COLLEGE

Tom is an expert in the area of individualized prior learning assessment (iPLA) request development, and author for request development process for labor leaders and students. He has coordinated and taught in a non-apprentice cohort program; mentored students selected as recipients for the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence; co-led a group of students to Geneva, Switzerland to attend an International Labor Organization's annual congress; and served on the editing committee for several issues of the publication, Labor Writes.

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SUNY Empire is a unique institution among Labor Studies programs across the country. We have maintained a strong dedication to the commitment that students' **learning outside of college should be valued academically**, so the experiential learning from workplaces and personal lives you bring to college count toward college credits where possible.



SUNY EMPIRE OFFERS SOLID LABOR-EDUCATION WITH REAL-WORLD EXPERIENCES

SUNY EMPIRE has a union relationship in what might be called a **solid labor-education practice**. This practice is strengthened by two key roles in which we partner to provide liberal studies courses – we offer apprentices 24 credits in worker-focused topics such as writing for workers, literature of the working class, other world civilizations, and economics of the labor movement – toward an Associates in Science degree in Labor Studies.

For those apprentices who are increasingly coming into the program with associate and bachelor degrees, we offer advanced-level courses such as Development of the Labor Movement, Labor on Film, and the Principles of Trade Unionism.

The second reason why SUNY Empire is uniquely posed to bring a dynamic labor studies program to prospective students is because we have experience teaching other unions as well. We have partnerships with the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers - the IAM and the International Union of Painters and Allied Trades and International Finishing Trades Institute.

This experience has strengthened our approach to not only teaching labor studies for labor leaders, but also improved our approach teaching courses such as Collective Bargaining and Labor-Management Relations, courses open to business students as well. At SUNY Empire the strength of our labor courses, be they Labor History courses or Labor Relations and Administration, and Labor Management Relations, is that you will find both management students and working class students together in the virtual classroom.



SUNY EMPIRE HAS ONE OF THE MOST DIVERSE PROGRAMS IN THE NATION

Our labor studies courses have had decades to steep in an educational model that is focused on the social history of labor and working-class struggles. We ask questions of our students such as: What makes the art of the street and the artist among the common person as important as the artist and art shown in a museum? In fact, how is graffiti even art or protest puppetry on par with the work in a gallery? We ask our students about literature written by poets who were fieldworkers in the San Juaquin Valley of California, or the history of the civil rights as told in graphic novels.

SUNY EMPIRE provides curriculum that exists outside of a need for a business school construct, but can be supportive of business students as well as labor studies students. We can cater to both the business student interested in working with labor leaders in a collective bargaining course, and we can cater to the labor leader interested in finding their roots in a literature or history course.
