

Q&A with Fannie Bishop

What year did you start at JobLink?

I still have a book club running which I started in the late 1990s and that is lots of fun. We laugh so much during our discussions of the books we choose. I hope to continue with that group.

What are your plans for retirement?

It will give me the credentials and knowledge to work at a hospice, nursing home or hospital playing my harp for patients. That may or may not pan out. I do hope to continue teaching a bit, but on a schedule that will allow me to travel overseas and here in the U.S. I will spend a month in Mexico in February in the same place where I lived many decades ago. And I hope to be able to do more watercolor painting. That would be fun!

What will you miss the most?

That's an easy question – the people! I will also miss seeing all the cool projects that people create in our learning center.






